



Parish Councillor Vacancies

There are two positions to fill on St Helens Parish Council.

The council is now seeking to fill these vacancies through the co-option of two volunteers.

Parish Council meetings are held at St Helens Community Hall on the second Monday of each Month at 7pm (except August). Additional extraordinary meetings may be called to discuss matters which need to meet specific deadlines or to address urgent issues.

The office of councillor is an unpaid position but a great opportunity to share and use experiences for the interest of the village.

To be eligible to stand for an election for St Helens parish, you must: over 18 years of age, be an elector of the parish; or. in the past 12 months have occupied (as owner or tenant) land or other premises in the parish; or. work in the parish (as your principal or only place of work).

Good communication skills, problem solving, analytical thinking and being a team player are all advantageous attributes. How much time does being a councillor take? As with anything, what you get out of being a Parish Councillor will depend on what you are able to put in.
